At BDS, we recognize that mentors are integral to our dynamic Team of Teams. In particular, I sincerely thank the mentors affiliated with two exceptional programs in Bay County— the Take Stock in Children program and the Elevate Bay program.

These programs exemplify excellence in community engagement and serve as beacons of hope for our students. The mentors involved in these initiatives are crucial in assisting students in need, providing encouragement, and fostering a positive learning environment. In a community where some students face economic challenges, Take Stock in Children stands out by offering scholarships to these families, aiming to keep students in school and support their journey to college graduation. Our Elevate Bay Program, under the excellent guidance of Stacey Legg, matches trained, background-checked volunteer mentors with students who could benefit from another caring adult in their lives. Research has consistently shown that mentorship programs are effective in reducing delinquency and preventing youth violence. Moreover, mentorship programs extend their reach to military youth, acknowledging their unique challenges. Military children often experience frequent moves, leaving behind friends and coping with the absence of a parent on active duty. Mentors not only contribute to academic excellence but have also been shown to alleviate symptoms of anxiety in these students, providing crucial support during times of parental deployment.

As we celebrate National Mentoring Month, let us raise awareness for these impactful organizations that play a vital role in our community.
