The importance of VPK programs cannot be overstated, as they play a pivotal role in ensuring that our students are kindergarten-ready, setting the stage for their success throughout their K-12 educational journey. Academic skills are undoubtedly crucial, but the "executive function" skills students acquire during their time in pre-k are equally important. These skills lay the foundation for a lifetime of learning and success.

LearningResources.com provides a comprehensive list of skills students learn in pre-k, and I would like to emphasize their significance.

Whether learned at home, in pre-k or some combination of both, these are the skills we hope you're focusing on with your four-year-olds, and these are the skills we really want students to have when they enroll in kindergarten.

- **Recognize Name:** This is important because your child's name will be prominently featured in his/her kindergarten classroom.
- **Name the Letters of the Alphabet:** Familiarity with at least half of the capital letters is essential for kindergarten readiness.
- Hold and Use Scissors Correctly: Scissor skills are fundamental and support fine motor development.
- Name and Recognize Colors: Color recognition aids in one of the earliest basic math skills sorting.
- **Count and Recognize Numbers to 10:** Counting, recognizing numbers, and understanding one-to-one correspondence are essential for early math skills.
- Make Rhymes: Recognizing words that rhyme is a crucial step in literacy development.

- Play and Share with Peers: Social development is as vital as academic development, so encourage your child to play and share with others.
- **Take Direction and Learn Resiliency:** Kindergarten involves following directions and learning resiliency, so practice these skills through family games.
- **Complete Basic Hygiene and Self-Care:** Independence in bathroom use, handwashing, and eating are important self-care skills for kindergarten.
