We have strong partnerships with all local law enforcement agencies (and our own safety and security team), our local military bases, chambers of commerce, business community members and faith-based organizations. We look forward to leveraging all those resources to support our students and staff.

On a more personal level, my wife Karen retired after 30 years as a classroom teacher with Bay District Schools, and both of our children (Taylor and Thomas) graduated from Bay District Schools. I have been supporting public education my whole life, and serving as your Superintendent just formalizes my commitment to our children and to our entire community.
