EXPULSION HEARING

Chairman Littleton called the hearing to order at 10:31 A.M.

The student's mother was present for the hearing which she requested to be held in private. The student was charged with Physical Attack on a School Board Employee. Attorney Hudson requested that School Board Exhibits #1 through #6 be admitted into evidence. Sworn testimony was given by Brian Bullock, Principal of Mosley High School, John Capes, Assistant Administrator of Mosley High School and SRD Brooks Atkinson.

Attorney Hudson stated that the student's parent(s) had submitted a signed waiver waiving their right to a hearing before the School Board on the Superintendent's recommendation for expulsion of the student and agreed that the School Board enter a Final Order of Expulsion under the terms recommended by the Superintendent as stated in the Superintendent's Notice of Recommended Expulsion and Notice of Hearing. The student is charged with an Out of School delinquent act which, if committed by an adult, would be a felony.

He feels the administrator is responsible to hire good teachers. The Superintendent has a box of evaluations in his office from other counties which are larger than Bay County. Littleton asked about the percentage of administrators and teachers that are highly effective. Dawn Capes will provide that to her.

Register stated this evaluation system is too lengthy and teachers need to teach, not worry about their evaluations. A good teacher will have positive results in the classroom. A pre-visit and a post-visit should be enough. There are too many interruptions in the classrooms. The Superintendent also provided a correction to page 68 in the manual. Walker asked about student growth vs. attendance. The Superintendent explained that a formula is used.
