#### VI. LEARNING COMMUNITY NEWS

#### A. Board Members & Superintendent

The Superintendent shared the latest Florida Child Wellbeing Report. The data mirrors the trend in Bay County. In 2008, we had 8 Title I schools and now have 27 Title I schools. He spoke about the need of mental health services for the younger students and working with local agencies. Littleton feels the local educational institutions should be working to build the pipeline to fill this need.

Walker asked about the mentoring program. The Superintendent said that it has helped to calm students down and be more positive. There are over 500 mentors that visit more than once a week. Walker also shared that he attended the MS/HS Art display and have some gifted artists and dedicated art teachers.

Moss appreciates Mr. Hall's passion and invited him to the ASPIRE workshop the following day.

Register shared that he attended the Arts Alive program and Janet Kessler did an excellent job. 500 seats were sold out and the talent was excellent. He attended the Honors Day at Mosley High School and this year the freshman class had more honors than other classes. In the evening will be the Empty Bowl program sponsored by Chautauqua and is always a pleasure to attend.

Littleton mentioned FSUPC is holding the Invention Convention for MS/HS students on April 28<sup>th</sup>. The Navy Base will be participating as well.

Suzanne Farrar shared that the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of Driver's Ed is beginning this year. Registration will be done on the Parent Portal. There are 240 slots.

Lee Stafford shared that Student Services has been working very closely with the local community agencies and will develop a flow chart of where to go when a student is having difficulties.
