FACILITIES WORKSHOP

Present: School Board Chairman Steve Moss; School Board Vice Chair Pamm Chapman; School Board Members Ginger Littleton, Ryan Neves and Jerry Register; Superintendent William Husfelt and Attorney Franklin Harrison.

The workshop was called to order at 3:00 p.m. by School Board Chairman Steve Moss. Superintendent Husfelt introduced Lee Walters, Director of Facilities.

Walters began with introducing Tonya and Chris with the Haggerty Group and a PowerPoint presentation titled, "Hurricane Michael: A Record-Breaking Storm".

Where Are We Now?

The district is making good progress but is not where it would like it to be. Bay High School, Rutherford High School, and Merritt Brown Middle School are the largest projects.

Bay High School Roofing Project

Culpepper Construction has an \$8 million-dollar contract on this school. Roofing is the number one goal at this point and repairs are completed inside as possible. Florida Architects will be building the STEM Building and the Fine Arts Center. The gym floor has been resurfaced.

Hiland Park Elementary

The school has been reroofed and 9 firms are currently working on different projects at the campus. The final punch list should be August 9th. The complete security fencing and covered walkways are finished.

Lynn Haven Elementary

The Media Center is getting a new roof. The new cafeteria withstood the storm and community meetings after the storm were held there.

Mosley High School – Multiple Projects

The roof on the gym, fencing, and bleachers needed to be replaced. The gym floor can be used. The baseball and softball fields were destroyed.

• The Process:

Who?

Facilities: Roofing, structural, mechanical, exterior, grounds including fencing and awnings, and interior finishes.

How?

Combination of hard bid projects, small scale continuing contracts, and large projects utilizing a construction manager (projects more than a million dollars).

FEMA with Facilities

Projects require a 3-step process, must evaluate the damage with current codes and standards, and identify mitigation efforts to prevent similar damages in the future. Currently, 76 DDD reviews have been approved by FEMA, 117 in FEMA grants awaiting review, and 87 in review with Bay District and the Haggerty Group.

428 Projects – FEMA

Generally, buildings and campuses damaged beyond 50%. Campuses currently identified are Everitt Middle, Springfield Elementary, Bay High's old gym, Tyndall Elementary Building 8, Lynn Haven Elementary gym, and several building at Haney Technical Center.

Challenges Ahead

Where are our students and when will they return? Do we repurpose or consolidate campuses? What area of Bay County will grow the quickest?

FEMA Required Bid Process

Bids must meet bid requirements in a stressed sub-contractor market. There must be a minimum of 3 bids and if 3 qualified bids are not received, the district must advertise again.

Playground Equipment

All of the Legacy Equipment has been removed and must be replaced with Sourcewell equipment on the Florida State Contract. 7 sets have been ordered using LCI funding.

Tyndall Air Force Base

The base is receiving \$250 million in disaster recovery funds to rebuild the base which is projected to be complete in 2023.

Debris and Tree Stump Removal

GPS coordinates are required on every stump and tree along with the degree of lean. The district must have dump truck tickets and debris monitors.

A. School Board Members and Attorney

1. Interlocal Agreement for Emergency Shelters in Bay County 2019 (SMF #13)

Sharon Michalik explained that this agreement is with the county and the district is the primary facilitator of the shelters. Shelter training has been ongoing and the district will work with the Red Cross but there will be a clear chain of command. Register did not agree with using the schools due to the mess after Hurricane Michael. Moss said he spoke with the county about getting out of the shelter business but there is no Plan B. Michalik stated that Deane Bozeman will be the only pet friendly shelter until the end of this year. Moss stated pets were the issue at the shelters.

Motion by Littleton, seconded by Neves, to approve. Motion approved 4-1 with Register voting no.

B. Operational Support Services

A. Bay District School Board Policy

1. 2.129 – Private Providers of Student Services (SMF #16)

This policy allows for profit providers to access students on campus due to the great need of mental health services.

2. 2.130 – Standards of Delivery of Services by Outside Providers (SMF #17)

This policy goes along with 2.129 for mental health services.
