We had Hurricane Michael and then the next year we experienced the COVID Pandemic with no face to face instruction after spring break. The pandemic struck at the height of the CTE Testing season. FLDOE did extend testing into the fall of 2020 and we had teachers testing down to the last possible day to provide our students with the opportunity to earn industry certifications in their career pathways. Reminders for Testing!

- 1.) Please remember that students can only test 3 times for a particular IC exam and attempts **MUST** be 21 days apart.
- 2.) All proctors should be authorized ahead of time and all CTE teachers and proctors **MUST** have been trained by their school testing coordinator, CTE Supervisor or CTE Coordinator before testing can occur.
- 4.) The teacher and proctor **MUST** have the **FORM FCAPEA-04** required by FLDOE on file before any testing can occur.
- 5.) All students **MUST** have a picture ID with a demographic and signature.6.) Please make sure all testing stations have testing blockers in place and the testing script is read and all of the paperwork is completed and
- of the paperwork is completed and turned into the testing coordinator at your school within 48 hours of the testing event.
