The Superintendent stated that the district has some challenges with the shelters. When employees work during an emergency, he wants to make sure they are reimbursed for their time. This agreement is with the county about the running of the shelter and reimbursement from the county. The MOU will come before the Board at a later date and 60-80 employees will be trained.
