BAY DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD MEETING FEBRUARY 23, 2021

EXPULSION HEARING – 10:00

BOARD MEETING – 1:00 P.M. – GINGER LITTLETON BOARD ROOM PUBLIC HEARING – 1:30 P.M.

Present: School Board Chairman Steve Moss; and School Board Members Winston Chester, Jerry Register and Brenda Ruthven, Sarah Whaler, Coordinator of Student Placement Options. Attorney Heather Hudson was connected electronically. School Board Member Pamm Chapman was absent.

Chair Steve Moss called the Expulsion Hearing to order at 10:07 A.M.

1) Rutherford High School student – S.C.

The student's father was present for the hearing which they requested to be held in private. The student was charged with Drug Sale/Distribution (Marijuana/Other) SESIR and was found in possession of 16 grams of marijuana and 6 vape pens. Sworn testimony was heard by Coy Pilson, Rutherford High School Principal, the student and the student's father.

Motion by Register to accept the Superintendent's recommendation (the student be expelled for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year and the 2021-2022 school year, including summer school and not be offered alternative placement during the expulsion period). Seconded by Chester. Motion was unanimously approved.

2). Rutherford High School student – N.M.

Sarah Whaler, Coordinator of Student Placement Options stated that the student's parent has submitted a signed waiver, waiving their right to a hearing before the School Board on the Superintendent's recommendation of expulsion of the student and agreed that the School Board enter a Final Order of Expulsion under the terms recommended by the Superintendent as stated in the Superintendent's Notice of Recommended Expulsion and Notice of Hearing.

The student was charged with an Off-Campus Felony, Principal to Grand Theft (Motor Vehicle), Principal to Grand Theft (Firearm) and Principal to Burglary of a Conveyance.

Motion by Chester, seconded by Register to accept the signed waiver with the Superintendent's recommendation (that the student by expelled for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year and all of the 2021-2022 school year,

including summer school and not be offered any alternative placement during the expulsion period). Motion was unanimously approved.
